

What is Your Church's Long-Term Vision?

A vision defined is a bold picture of what your church will be in the future. It's a *preferred* future with a *shared* purpose that benefits your community.

What audacious goals come to your mind as you think through this vision? In other words, if your church could accomplish anything you wanted it to, what would you do?

As you pray, what is God burning in your heart to do? What is His unique vision and focus for your church?

"Vision without action is merely a dream. Action without vision just passes the time. Vision with action can change the world" (Joel A. Barker). Envision the future God gave you for your church and list ways that unique vision will impact your church and community in the next 3-5 years.



How to Craft Bold Goals in Alignment with Your Church's Vision

When defining church goals, asking the right questions can help clarify priorities, identify opportunities, and set a clear direction for the congregation. Here are some key questions to consider:

What is the Mission of Your Church?

Start by revisiting the mission statement of the church. In other words, what is your purpose, and what are you called to do as a community of faith?

When setting goals, aligning with this mission statement ensures that every action, initiative, and endeavor serves the larger purpose of the church. It provides a clear direction and focus and guides decision-making and resource allocation toward fulfilling the mission.

What Are Your Church's Core Values?

Reflect on the fundamental beliefs and principles that guide the church's identity and decision-making. What values are most important to you and your church, and how do they inform your goals?

By incorporating your church's values into goal setting, you reinforce those values and ensure that your goals are consistent with the ethical, moral, and spiritual principles that underpin the church's beliefs.

How to Craft Bold Goals:

Consider these overarching tips when crafting your goals.

Dream Big:

Don't limit yourself. Imagine the extraordinary and believe it's possible.

Be Specific:

Clearly articulate what success looks like and how you'll measure it.

Break It Down:

Divide big goals into smaller, manageable tasks to maintain momentum and track progress.

Set Deadlines:

Establish realistic timelines to keep you focused and accountable.

Stay Flexible:

Adapt as needed, embrace challenges, and learn from setbacks.

Overcoming Common Challenges

Fear of Failure:

Embrace failure as a natural part of growth and learning. Use setbacks as opportunities to refine your approach and persevere.

Lack of Resources:

Be resourceful and creative in finding solutions. Leverage existing assets and seek support from stakeholders and partners.

Resistance to Change:

Communicate the benefits of bold goals, rally support, and lead by example to inspire others to embrace change.



Unlocking Success: Breaking Down Large Goals into Achievable Milestones


What are the ultimate outcomes you seek to achieve?

THE SMART APPROACH

When planning goals, set SMART objectives that are "Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-bound." With God's help, what SMART goals do you believe you and your church can achieve?

Specific:

Clearly define what you want to achieve.

Measurable: Establish criteria for measuring success.

Achievable:

Challenging but realistic within your capabilities.

Relevant:

Aligned with your vision, values, and priorities.

Time-bound:

Set a deadline to create a sense of urgency and accountability.

Example: "Increase weekly attendance (specific) by 25% (measurable) within six months (time-bound) by implementing targeted outreach strategies and enhancing community engagement events (achievable and relevant)."

Your Next Steps: Establishing Accountability for Your Bold Goals

Clearly communicate roles and expectations to ensure alignment and accountability.

- Is there clarity of the Vision and Mission?
- Do you have alignment within and around the Values and Goals?
- Are your goals measurable?
- Do you have a "next step" process in place to keep you on course?

The key to success is being able to zero in on the actionable items of today.
